PRINCIPAL'S REPORT



NATIONAL RECONCILIATION WEEK BE BRAVE. MAKE CHANGE

This week (27 May to 3 June 2022) we have been celebrating National Reconciliation Week. National Reconciliation Week (NRW) is a time for all Australians to learn about our shared histories, cultures, and achievements, and to explore how each of us can contribute to achieving reconciliation in Australia.

The date for this week is specifically chosen to commemorate two significant milestones in the reconciliation journey-the successful 1967 referendum, and the High Court Mabo decision respectively.

27 May 1967 On this day, Australia's most successful **referendum** saw more than 90 per cent of Australians vote to give the Australian Government power to make laws for Aboriginals and Torres Strait Islander people and recognise them in the Census.

3 June 1992 On this day, the Australian High Court delivered the Mabo decision, the culmination of Eddie Koiki Mabo's challenge to the legal fiction of 'terra nullius' (land belonging to no one) and leading to the legal recognition of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people as the Traditional Owners and Custodians of lands. This decision paved the way for Native Title.

In 2022, the theme for NRW is "Be Brave. Make Change." It is a challenge to all Australians to 'be brave' to tackle the unfinished business of reconciliation that will 'make change' for the benefit of all Australians.

At Bendigo SDS, we have also recognised National Sorry Day on 26th May 2022. During humanities classes over the past two weeks, students have explored what Sorry Day represents for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people and have begun to understand the impact of the past for families of the Stolen Generations. We have learnt how acknowledging these impacts is an important part of healing, just like when you hurt somebody, even by accident, that saying sorry helps to rebuild a relationship.

Students have created some amazing artworks on paper handprints and then have created a public display on a decorated tree which symbolises walking hand in hand to show respect to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander land and culture. The display has a sign that reads "We show respect. We share the land. We walk together, Hand in Hand." It has been a great learning experience for all of our students to extend on one of our school School Wide Positive Behaviour Support (SWPBS) mantra's in 'Showing Respect' in the context of culture and community.

ILLNESS and CHANGE

Firstly, I have to thank everyone within our school community for their patience, understanding and flexibility in working with the challenging times we currently find ourselves in, which are, I think fair to say, probably the most difficult of the entire pandemic with regard to the impact of illness on our students and their learning. Having just returned today after having COVID myself, I am acutely aware of how staff being away, either through isolation or because of other illnesses that are increasing in transmission such as influenza (the flu) and gastro, has been having a direct bearing on the number of staff available to support individual learning programs.

The challenge that this has posed for our students has been, at times, a change to their usual staff and program. The opportunities that this has afforded has been students increasing their capacity to accept and manage change, an inevitable part of life, whilst in a continuously supportive environment. It has also been an opportunity for students to work with different staff and for students to work alongside different peers. If at any stage you have concerns about how your child in managing these changes, please do not hesitate to contact the school. Unfortunately, it would seem that these circumstances are not going to change before the end of the term, so we would rather be proactive about supporting any concerns you may have rather than just waiting for this time to pass.

STAYING HOME FROM SCHOOL

On that note, can I please implore parents to ensure that students <u>do not</u> come to school with illness symptoms. These include, runny noses, coughs, feeling hot, or feeling cold, or showing signs that are not in character with a student's 'normal' base line behaviour. If a child presents in this way, we will be sending them home, even if a COVID test has been undertaken that morning and it is negative. Flus and colds still pose a health risk to other students.


Additionally, a child is to be excluded for 24 hours from their last loose bowel motion (diarrhoea) and/or vomit.

This means that if a child has either one of these instances at school and is sent home, they cannot return to school the next day. We all understand that there are many pressures on working and care giving parents and carers and how disruptive non-school attendance can be for our students. Whilst we appreciate the inconvenience and potential negative impact on students needing to stay home or be collected because they are unwell, and we absolutely prioritise the care and safety of our students, we are, after all, a school, and not a care giving or respite facility.

DEBUTANTE BALL

Preparations are continuing to progress as we head towards what will be an incredible night for our students and families, our "Dancing Under the Stars" Debutante Ball. All of the 17 couples (18 students) have been doing a wonderful job learning their dances, and I know that there have been many shopping trips to organise dresses, suits, shoes, ties, and accessories to ensure that our couples look the part. This will take place on Friday 17th June at the All-Seasons Hotel Complex. CSEF APPLICATIONS CLOSING SOON

Dear parents and carers.

We have noticed a number of families are eligible for CSEF, "Camps, Sports and Excursions Funds". An application is often filled out when students first enrol in school. But sometimes they are missed in the mass of paperwork or circumstances can change.

To be eligible, parents need a Centrelink Pensioner Concession or Health Care card (note: the card must be in the parent's name, not the child's name).

This can save families quite a bit of money and support kids to access excursions.

If you hold one of these concession cards, please come and see us in the office asap to fill out a simple form or complete the form which is included in this week's newsletter. The application form and additional information will be made available on our Bendigo SDS website (https://www.bendigosds.vic.edu.au/) as well.
