PRINCIPAL'S REPORT



FLOODING SITUATION

Thank you for your flexibility and understanding yesterday as we experienced a significant weather event that had an impact on our normal school programming and transport arrangements. At this stage, we believe that the bus runs will re-commence again on Monday, however, we will keep you informed over the weekend should that situation change. Thankfully, we have not sustained any flood damage to the school buildings, however, we know that there is much more rain to come, and we will continue to keep you updated should there need to be further change to our normal programming. In the interim, can I please urge you to heed flood warnings, never drive through flood waters and stay safe, warm and dry.

GRADUATION – THURSDAY 8th DECEMBER

We have a small, but no less accomplished and deserving number of students graduating this year, and to celebrate, we will be having a Graduation Luncheon on Thursday 8th December in The Conservatory at the All Seasons. This will be a wonderful opportunity for our graduating students and their families, and our senior students to come together to take a look back at the achievements of our graduates, and then cast their eyes forward to share in the excitement of the paths ahead for our young adults. Ticket pricing for the families of graduates is currently being finalised, but we would encourage you to contact the office and nominate how many tickets you would like to secure.



END OF PANDEMIC ORDERS

You may be aware that the Victorian Government has announced changes to the COVID-19 isolation requirements. This means that from 11.59pm on Wednesday 12 October, the mandatory orders around isolation for people with COVID-19 has ended and instead we move to health advice recommendations for people with COVID-19 or COVID-19-like symptoms. Our school will continue to adhere to the Department of Health's recommendations to ensure that our school remains a safe environment for our staff and students.

The Department of Health <u>strongly recommends</u> that students and school staff:

- who test positive to COVID-19 stay home and isolate for 5 days and do not attend school after 5 days if they are still symptomatic.
- who are symptomatic but have not tested positive not attend school. This does not include students with pre-existing conditions such as hay fever.

Parents and carers are recommended to continue to report their child having COVID-19 to both the school and the Department of Health. We will, however, no longer report occurrences of positive cases to the school community. We ask parents and carers to continue to remain vigilant in preventing COVID-19 transmission. Any student who is unwell should continue to remain at home. This is about keeping students healthy and well in our school and reducing the spread of both COVID-19 and other respiratory diseases. Free rapid antigen tests are available at the school for those who need them, and we will continue to contact parents and carers if their child shows symptoms while at school in order for them to be collected. To keep our school as safe as possible, we will also continue to use air purifiers and other COVID-19 prevention measures. Thanks for your continued efforts to keep our school community safe and well, and please do not hesitate to contact me should you have any questions with regard to this.

IMPORTANT DATES

Term Four is always a very busy time, however, I would like to remind you all of some incredibly important dates on our calendar. A reminder that the Bendigo Cup Day on Wednesday 28th October is allocated as the public holiday instead of the Melbourne Cup Day within the Bendigo area. This can be confusing as many of our students and their families live outside of the immediate Bendigo area. Melbourne Cup Day will be a normal school day for us. The Common Professional Practice Day for the teaching staff will be held on Thursday 24th November as the Department of Education and Training has provided schools with the option to hold each teacher's allocated professional practice day on the same day for all staff in order to assist with casual relief teaching shortages. This will be a student free day. Other important dates are our Student Support Group (SSG) or Student Achievement Day (SAC) conferences to take place on Friday 9th December and the last day for students will be Monday 19th December, with Tuesday 20th December being a Pupil Free Day to allow for the pack up and moving of classrooms in preparation for 2023.

VALE PIPER PAIN

We are so saddened to share with you that one of our former students, Piper Pain, who moved back to Mildura Specialist School at the start of the year, passed away on 22 September 2022. Piper was a much-loved member of the room 8/9 classroom in her time at Bendigo SDS, who had the biggest smile and the most infectious of giggles, and was one of those people who just lit up a room as soon as she came in to it. As a school community, we send our deepest sympathies and love to her parents Summer and Michael, her siblings Willow and Finn, and her extended family and friends. A number of staff were able to travel to Mildura for Piper's funeral and we were privileged to share in a celebration of her life, love and legacy, and with the permission of her family, we would like to share the priceless keepsake card that was given to attendees on the day.




WELLBEING SUPPORT TEAM


NEWS FROM OUR GARDENING GROUP




