We are meeting with the NDIS team from Intereach, to ask all our questions regarding NDIS funding in relation to next year's program. Be aware that once you have chosen your program you need to share this with NDIS, so that they can fund the program and put in all the supports your young person will need. This is likely to mean a plan review. Now is a good time to think really broadly about your young person's needs. It will be a good time to meet the other parents, ask questions (that everyone is asking) and to understand more about how NDIS works for school leavers. Kim Giles and Meg Holmes will be hosting and joining the discussion. This is a very important meeting, so please make all efforts possible to attend. Your young person may like to be involved with you and are welcome to attend. If so, please collect them from school and sign them out to attend with you. Even if your child is in Year 11, this is a great session to attend, so that you are well informed in relation to NDIS funding in the future.

Bendigo Special Developmental School makes every effort to keep the contribution requests to a minimum and affordable for all parents.



FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access to all
 items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the standard curriculum
 requirements in Victorian Curriculum F-10, VCE and VCAL.
- · Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.

PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:



Curriculum Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.

Other

Voluntary financial contributions for noncurriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.

Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

 Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g. textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



SCHOOL PROCESSES

 Schools must obtain school council approval for their parent payment arrangements and publish all requests and communications for each year level on their school website for transparency.

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MY TIME SUPPORT GROUP

My Time support groups are a support group for carers of children who have additional needs.

The support group is not for just a specific diagnosis but is open to carers who care for any child with additional needs.

This group provides a supportive space for parents and carers to feel understood and share ideas about managing a range of situations.

MyTime groups are for parents and carers of a child with a disability, developmental delay or chronic medical condition.


A FREE service where you can socialise and share ideas with others who understand caring for a child with additional needs.
