

PRINCIPAL'S REPORT



SCHOOL CAPTAINS

Last week we were very excited to announce our School Captains for 2023. The students were elected by their peers, a process which is an important part of the teaching process about democracy, the voting process, and the roles and responsibilities of citizenship.

I am very excited to announce our School Captains are Mollie Allen, Daniel Kennedy, Laura Murray, and Hamish Skirka.

It was wonderful to have all their families on hand at assembly last Friday for their announcement, and we know they will do a wonderful job representing the views of the student body and representing the school in the community. Congratulations to them all!

BUILDING UPDATE

Last week, Dehne and I visited five other special schools across the state with the appointed architects from ePlus Architecture as part of preparing to enter the "Schematic Design' stage of our upgrade process.

It was a whirlwind tour, and the drive in between gave us plenty of time to discuss what we saw and what we thought worked and didn't work.

We visited Sunbury and Macedon Ranges Specialist Schools' Bullengarook Campus, Springvale Park Special Developmental School, Officer Specialist School, Latrobe Special Developmental School, and Sale Specialist School.

There were vastly different designs between schools, and it interesting to see what school communities had prioritised throughout the building process. The way a building design works is that schools are allocated a certain amount of square metres floorspace dependent on the enrolment number of the school that is being built.

Currently our school is being built for 168 students, however, this will change as we go along the process, as our trend data predicts that our enrolments will exceed that number in a couple of years' time. Schools have some discretion of how to break up that space, and from those we visited, some allocated more to classrooms, and some allocated more to communal spaces and what is known as 'circulation' spaces to link classrooms together.

There will be an opportunity for everyone in our school community to have input into these designs, although it must be said, that we will most certainly be guided by the architects, as their area expertise is making spaces functional. To this end, Nick, Rachel, Kristen Terry, and architects involved in this project are spending a significant amount of time in the school and are gaining more and more knowledge about the specific needs school of our community

PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

MATHEMATICS GRANT UPDATE

Many of you will recall that we successful in securing significant grant last year through SchoolsPlus program advance our mathematics teaching and learning programs. We have undergone our 12-month acquittal process with allocated coach. Dr Adrian Bertolini.

I am so pleased to report that we have been applauded for our progress, so much so, that Mathematics Victoria has asked our school to write a journal article for their quarterly magazine of our learning journey over the last 12 months.

This last year, however, is only the start of our focus on mathematics and over the course of this year, we are excited to be moving to the next stage of our project, which involves parents and carers becoming part of the learning process.

We look forward to hosting a number of mathematics activity nights for families, and we will continue to share information with you, via the newsletter, our Facebook page and SeeSaw, about the different ways that our students are learning and applying mathematical concepts to ultimately make them more numerate.

SCHOOL COUNCIL


