PRINCIPAL'S REPORT



RETURNING TO SCHOOL

We are half way through a staggered return to school which has allowed all students to return for at least two days. As a reminder, next week is a repeat of this week, and the following week we will see all students return to school from Tuesday 26th October. This will be the end of remote learning for all students. We appreciate that this has been an extended and difficult time for many of our students and families. As teaching teams, we too have missed the opportunity to gain the momentum in learning that is best supported by students' onsite attendance, and an opportunity to experience the full range of learning programs that we design for our students. Thank you for partnering with us over this time to continue learning for your child in the home; you are your children's first teachers and the most knowledgeable, and have been required to call on so many of these skills over the last, now, 18 months. We do know, however, that for some families there has been some silver lining on the remote learning clouds and one of the biggest joys for us as a school, has been our ability to share pictures and videos through SeeSaw and for the chance to show case and connect families and learning activities through our Facebook page. These will continue to be great tools that we access and expand upon into the future.

VACCINATIONS

The looming vaccination deadlines for all staff working in the Department of Education and Training under the Chief Health Officers

has created some confusion directive, regarding the vaccination status of students. Students do not need to be vaccinated to attend school. Families are also not required to inform the school of your child's COVID vaccination status at this stage. If you would like to share that information with the school however, you are welcome to do so. You will all have received the survey link that I sent home from DET to gather further information about how DET can assist students with disabilities to access vaccinations. At this stage, I have not been advised of any in school COVID vaccination programs that will take place, however, if they were to, they would follow the processes of the current immunisation program that runs in schools for conditions such as HPV papillomavirus) and dTps (Diphtheria-tetanuspertussis), were parent consent forms and information regarding the immunisation are sent home, and must be returned before a child will be immunised. If you do have any questions about the process for vaccinations taking place at school, or the vaccination status of your child, COVID, or otherwise, please do not hesitate to contact me at any stage.

MASKS

Many of you will be aware that one of the directives from the Chief Health Officer is that children in Grades 3-6 must wear a mask at all times whilst at school. You will also be aware that people with disabilities do have an exemption from wearing masks. For this reason, as has been the case over the last 18 months, we will not be enforcing the wearing of masks on students whilst at school. If students, would like to wear them, then we are more than happy to support that occurring.













CANCELLATION OF DEBUTANTE BALL AND SAVE THE DATE FOR GRADUATION LUNCHEON

Unfortunately there was no 'third time lucky' for us in setting a third date for our 2021 Debutante Ball. Due to be staged tonight, I don't need to outline, I am sure, the reasons why we are not able to go ahead with this fabulous night. We understand the immense disappointment for our students and their families and are hopeful that we will be able to finish the year on a high by hosting a Graduation Luncheon on Thursday 9th December. This event for students and their families will be held at the Conservatory at the All Seasons for our graduating students and their families. At this stage we are hoping that our students who are in the equivalent of

year 9 and above, will attend this luncheon alongside families and staff, however, further details, and associated permission forms etc, will be sent home closer to the date, and when a further understanding of what stage of the roadmap to COVID normal, we will be at.


Ask Izzy is a website that connects people in need with housing, a meal, money help, family violence support, counselling and much more. It is free and anonymous, with over 370,000 services listed across

Scope is one of Australia's largest providers of disability support services. We have over 70 years' experience supporting people with physical, intellectual, and multiple disabilities and developmental delays within Bendigo and Victoria wide. Our Hub vision is to work with people with disability and Community Partners to co-design a program of out of hours activities that meet access and inclusion needs, and foster connections that will promote quality of life for all.

Conducting activities throughout the year, predominantly on weekday evenings and Saturday mornings, the Hub will support positive life opportunities for people with disability and will accommodate a wide age group (5-17yr, 18-40 yr, 41 plus).

Activities and partnerships will be driven by community needs. The aim of the Inclusive Community Hub is to provide a safe and inclusive environment that will become an information and support mecca for all of Bendigo's community members
