PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

REPORTS

Next week, you will receive your child's semester (term 1 and 2) report.

This report is part of our requirement to provide all parents and carers with a written overview of your child's attainment against the Victorian Curriculum and is a mandatory requirement of the Department of Education.

It is a snap shot of some of the learning content that your child has been engaging with this semester, both from a subject specific point of view and with what is known as the cross curriculum capabilities.

These are skills that students learn across all of the curriculum areas and represent the social and emotional personal capabilities that underpin learning.

Teachers have created these reports by assessing your child's attainment in specific areas by means of formal testing, through moderation processes between teachers and education support staff where they discuss and agree upon a student's skill level, and by using the Victorian Curriculum to identify key abilities within a learning level.

Every student is measured against their own progress, not against any other cohort, and takes into account the student's ability to demonstrate a set skill in different environments across the school and with differing people across the school.

You will have an opportunity to discuss your child's report in detail with their teacher in the early weeks of Term 3 at a Student Support Group meeting day, which will be held on Monday 31st July. This meeting, will also be a time to revisit your child's Individual Education Plan to identify their progress against their individual goals and reset goals for the next semester, should that be appropriate.

If you would like to understand more about the Victorian Curriculum and how our teaching and learning programs are devised, please do not hesitate to contact your teacher, or myself and we can arrange for a time for you to ask all of your questions.

NAIDOC WEEK 2-9TH JULY 2023



National NAIDOC week is celebrated in the first week of July every year.

NAIDOC stands for National Aborigines and Islander Day Observance Committee and was originally formed from a number of other Aboriginal associations that were formed in the 1920s.

The purpose of these groups was to highlight the inequity and treatment of Aboriginal Australians.

In 1955, the then named 'Aborigines Day' was established as the first Sunday in July and was to be a day to celebrate the Aboriginal Culture. In 1974, the one day was expanded to a week of celebrations and in 1991, the growing awareness of the distinct cultural history of Aboriginal people and Torres Strait Islander people saw the birth of NAIDOC.

Since then, a theme has been identified each year, and gives an opportunity to reflect important issues and events for Aboriginal and Torres Strait islander people.

This year's theme is "For the Elders" and gives us an opportunity to explore how we acknowledge and respect Aboriginal elders, from the past, the present and how we look to support and contribute to the elders of the future.


OUR FURRY FRIENDS IN ROOM 18

The classroom has started intergrading Squeak and Peppa into sections of their educational programs, helping students further engage in these programs.


Classrooms across the school are booking their visits with Squeak and Peppa – how exciting!
