PRINCIPAL'S REPORT



Hello BSDS Community

COVID update

Thank you everyone for your patience and understanding during the recent sharp lockdown and return to remote learning for three days. We appreciate how difficult such sudden changes at short notice are for all of our families, as to our staff. Thankfully the lockdown had the desired effect and the lockdown has ended. We are, however, aware that this kind of lockdown could potentially happen again before the full vaccination program has been completed in Victoria, and more widely in Australia. As such, if there was to be another instance of this type of snap lock down, we will adopt the same model of remote learning through the SeeSaw app. I am aware that for some, there may have been some confusion between the two different SeeSaw apps. We have included an explanation from our Learning Specialist, Chris Smith, in this newsletter. If you feel that you need further support to access these SeeSaw apps, please do not hesitate to contact the school and speak to your teacher or Chris himself.

Cultural Day

What an amazing celebration we had on Thursday 11 February. Auntie Marilyn Nicholls opened the celebrations with a Smoking Ceremony & Welcome to Country, sharing the creation story of Bunjil and how he made the land. Auntie Marilyn then announced the Dja Dja Wurrung name given to our undercover area of our school is 'Manya' meaning 'Meeting Site'. (It is pronounced Ma-na). During the Ceremony students listened to the captivating didgeridoo playing of Jason Kerr, while watching the smoke rise across our new area, and smelt the gum as the medicinal leaves smoked.

The Koorie Engagement Support Officer (KESO)Team from the Department of Education facilitated activities that included Boomerang painting, Rock Art, Ochre Face Painting, traditional games like Juluhya, Weme & Koolchee Koolchee. The students also explored artefacts worn for ceremonies, spears, shields, boomerangs and tools used for gathering foods, carrying young children, preparing foods on and weapons for hunting. Bush Tucker was on offer, prepared by the Murnong Mammas. Students, staff and parents and visitors tried roasted emu, marinated in salt bush and strawberry gum, crocodile, kangaroo sausage rolls, vegetarian sausage rolls and kangaroo meatballs with tomato chutney. The word around the school was the kangaroo sausage rolls and kangaroo meatballs were the BEST of them all!

A huge thank you to everyone who made today's celebrations possible, especially to Fiona Gray, our Koori Liaison Teacher, who has spent many months behind the scenes organising such an important day for our school and the Specialist Teacher team, who met with Simon Briggs, KESO, to learn all of the Indigenous games prior to the day.

We look forward to many more school community events being held in our newly named space, 'Manya'.

Individual Education Plan (IEP)

You will all be aware of the Personalised Learning and Support Plans that our school has used to identify the learning goals for each child. These goals are developed in conjunction with families and other professionals who may be part of a student's support group at Great Start Conferences (GSC) or Student Achievement Conferences (SAC). Last year the Department of Education brought in a new template that is to be used across the entire Victorian system known as the Individual Education Plan. Whilst the format may look a different, the intent and content is still the same. These plans guide the specific learning goals for each student that will be woven into the learning programs across the week and term. These goals are then updated and their achievement and progress commented upon in Term 3. These plans are different to the academic based reports that you receive on your child at the end of each semester. Those academic reports provide a detailed overview of your child's attainment and progress against the Victorian Curriculum levels. This can all seem a













bit confusing, so if you do have any questions, please do not hesitate to contact myself, our Leading Teacher of Curriculum Tania Franks, or your classroom teacher.

SeeSaw

There was some confusion around the two different Seesaw apps as we unexpectedly re-entered remote learning at the beginning of this week.

- The **Seesaw Parent and Family** app is the primary app for parents and family members. It allows up to 10 family members to connect to the school to view posts to their child's journal including photos, videos, drawings or Seesaw activities. It also allows family members to easily privately message their child's classroom teacher and receive class-wide announcements.
- The Seesaw Class app is for teachers and students. Teachers and students primarily use this at school to post photos, videos, drawings or Seesaw activities to their journal, so that family members can view them through the family app. This is the app that was used for remote learning last year. Due to the short notice of the state returning to remote learning, we recommended to teachers to send links to external activities through the Parent and Family app for the 3 days as it would be difficult to send out devices and remote learning codes for the whole school in such a short time frame.
- Going forward, please use the **Seesaw Parent and Family** app to link with your child's work journal and to privately message your child's classroom teacher. In case of another snap lockdown and return to remote learning, please use the **Seesaw Class** app and we will ensure that all families have their student's remote learning codes in preparation.

School Council Elections

The School Council March meeting, which will be held on 15th March 2021 at 7pm in the staff room, will be our Annual General Meeting. I would encourage all parents and carers to come along and celebrate the achievements of our school over the past year and consider nominating to become a member of the School Council. Elections will also take place for positions that have become vacant due to the completion of the two year elected terms of several parent and DET representatives. Our school community is indebted to parent representatives Leah Thomas, our current School Council President, Louise Spofforth, Kylie Cleever, Rebecca Quinn, Sarah Chignell, Vicki Gordon and Shanelle Cooper, and our community representatives Angela Whalen and current Vice President, and Bob Wiseman, and DET representatives, Barb Johnstone, Davina McCurdy, Tania Franks and Kirsty Phillips. Due to some parent terms ending, we have 6 parent positions available this year. Whilst all of our representative are able to renominate, I am aware that Louise Spofforth and Kylie Cleever will not be doing so. I would like to thank both Louise and Kylie for the incredible contribution they have made to our school over many years of service. We wish them every future success. Joining the School Council will give you the opportunity to have a direct say in the future direction of our school, which is a wonderful way to shape the learning of your child. 

Hands and feet to yourself

For weeks 4-6 of Term 1 at school, our SWPBS teaching focus is: 'Be your best' by 'keeping hands and feet to yourself'. We know at Bendigo Special Developmental School that our students often use their hands to interact with the world around them. Often this is done in a fun and safe manner, however, this is not always the case. It is important that we teach students when to keep their hands and feet to themselves, the way we would teach any academic skill (e.g. adding two numbers together). When we have taught students, we must then monitor and provide feedback to ensure they can refine the skill during their schooling journey. When we teach clear expectations for different locations throughout our school there is less confusion for our students. This leads to more comfort and security for all.

In this Therapy SPOT we want to say a massive well done to all of the school community - students, parents and staff for their flexibility and resilience in getting through another Lockdown.

With sudden changes to routine and times of uncertainty for adults and children there can be lots of different feelings and consequent challenging behaviours.

From a wellbeing and physical health perspective we would encourage you to try and keep a simple routine that works for you and your family in difficult times. Having a schedule that helps your child understand what will be happening through the day can be very useful.

Trying to keep doing some physical activities can help with physical and emotional wellbeing. Lockdowns and hot weather can make this very difficult.

You could try some ideas like:

- Going for an outdoor scavenger hunt looking for objects of different colours, shapes, weight or properties
- Watching Youtube videos that encourage movement like Go Noodle clips, action songs, or your favourite songs to dance to
- Setting up an obstacle course around your home or yard
- Playing balloon volleyball inside
- Playing 'the floor is lava' crossing the room only standing on 'safe' areas like cushions on the floor
- Water play

SunSmart



We would like to remind parents/carers that we have a SunSmart Policy that outlines the procedures to keep our students safe during our warmer months. We encourage students and staff to wear broad-rimmed hats and apply sunscreen before each playtime and outdoor activities. The school supplies the sunscreen. If your child has any allergies to brands of sunscreen please advise your teacher or office staff to organise a Student Health Support Plan so we can arrange for appropriate accommodations.

Conveyance Allowance 2021

In some locations, eligible students are unable to access free school buses, or have to travel 4.8 kms or more to the bus pick up/drop off point.

The conveyance allowance helps cover the costs resulting from any transport gaps between the public transport system and the school bus network, or where multiple transport services are required to get to and from school.

The allowance can be applied to the use of public transport, private cars, private buses and taxis.

Eligibility for a conveyance allowance is based on the following criteria:

- Students must attend the nearest specialist school
- Students must live at least 4.8km from the school or nearest bus pick up / drop off point.

If you consider your child is eligible for this allowance please contact the office for an application form as soon as possible.

If you have already applied successfully in 2020 and your circumstances have not changed, you are not required to reapply in 2021.
