

PRINCIPAL'S REPORT



NEW REPORTING APPROACH AND FORMAT

As part of the School Review process, you may recall that one of the key areas identified for improvement was the documenting and mapping of the curriculum journey our students will take as they pass through our school. The primary focus of this was to be able to document the learning and extra curricula opportunities available to our students at the various ages and stages that are characterised by a sub school type, to limit the over teaching and under teaching our students experience, and to see a progression of skills in our students as we work towards their post school pathways.

The newly established Curriculum Team, have started this work by identifying the ages and stages of students and thinking about what the core curriculum areas of English, Mathematics, Personal and Social Capability, Critical and Creative Thinking, and Resilience, Rights and Respectful Relationships (RRRR) look like during these stages, most notably, what is being taught and why it is important for the learning of the student. These are described in the 'Overviews' and students will receive a colour coded report that relates to their years of schooling.

The breakup for sub schools has been identified as such:

Early Years	Ages 5 - 8	First 3 years of School	
Junior School	Ages 9 - 12	4th - 7th years of School	
Middle School	Ages 13 - 16	8th - 11th years of School	
Senior School	Ages 17 - 18	12th and 13th years of School	

We are very grateful for the input of our School Council, who gave feedback on the overviews and the format of the report. We also took into account the feedback that you all shared with us through the survey that was available during first term.

A process such as this is always an evolving document, and as the new and reviewed Curriculum in the Foundations Levels A-D are released, we will need to update the overviews and potentially the format.

The Student Support Group meetings are a great way to share your thoughts on this new approach with your teacher and of course, talk about the learning progress and the next steps for your young person. SSG Day will be on Wednesday 6th August 2025, so please mark the date in your calendar. Booking times and processes will be shared early next term.

Next week, we reach a critical juncture in our building program, with the demolition of classrooms 8 and 9, which will see a walkway created between the Agora and the Main Playground, and a path to the new building.

School Visits - Mobile Dental Van

Dear Parent / Guardian,

The Martin Vale Dentistry's Mobile Dental Van will be conducting dental visits to your school, preschool or kinder. The treatment can be BULK BILLED through Medicare Child Dental Benefits Scheme (CDBS) for eligible students Student that are not eligible for CDBS have the option to receive treatment at the Medicare prices as a private patient.

The following explains the steps involved and options.

1

Our First Visit

Students Eligible for CDBS:

Will receive an examination, X-rays, fluoride and fissure sealants, scale and clean.

Parents are contacted by phone, SMS or email soon after their child has been seen to discuss a treatment plan using the available CDBS funds.

Students NOT Eligible for CDBS: You have a choice: (tick one)

Pay for a \$99 Van Special:

This includes a comprehensive exam, X-rays and a dental clean.

OF

Receive a complementary dental screening only.

Follow Up Visit

We will schedule a date to return to your school, preschool or kinder to proceed with the treatment plan we have discussed with you after gaining your consent.

Parents are welcome to attend while their child has their treatment in the Van or if being seen at the Martin Vale Dentistry practice in Bendigo.

If your child requires further or urgent dental treatment and Mobile Dental Van return date does not suit, please note you have the option to schedule the treatment in our private practice at 116 Queen Street Bendigo.


