

SWPBS CELEBRATION

Today has been a massive day of celebration at Bendigo SDS.

Firstly, as you will be aware, for the whole school celebration for our students who have reach their acknowledgement goal.

Secondly, as we received notification yesterday that we have been successful in reaching the Bronze Level Accreditation for our SWPBS implementation.

This means that we have achieved a very high level of proficiency and fidelity across all areas of our school (students, staff and parents and carers) in that everyone understands what SWPBS, what our mantra behaviours are (Act Safely, Show Respect, Be Your Best) and that everyone across the school is using the same language to support, engage and reinforce positive behaviour being displayed. It's a huge undertaking and I have to congratulate the incredible SWPBS Leadership team, lead by our Occupational Therapist Hamish Morcom, in receiving this recognition from the Department of Education. What a way to end the term!



NEW BUILDING UPDATE

During the general meeting at school council on 20th March, the Masterplan document called the AMP 2 (all 179 pages of it) was discussed in detail. Following this process, the school council has endorsed the masterplan, which means that we now move to the next stage of the design process.

Now that the AMP 2 document has been approved by the school, it needs to go back to the Victorian Schools Building Authority (VSBA) and a 'prep' meeting is convened. This meeting is where the masterplan is presented to a panel of independent auditors who decide whether the masterplan serves as a good investment for the Department of Education and the VSBA. Once this is approved, which we are sure it will be, that is when the architects will move to the 'schematic design stage' where they actually design the intricacies of each space, based on the feedback that we have had from you as a parent/carer group, the staff, the students and the school council.

There will be opportunities to further comment on the initial designs once they are completed.

At this stage, we have only received funding for one building, however, we continue to remain hopeful given the support of our local politicians, both Jacinta Allan and Maree Edwards, who are very supportive of our school and the education of our students.

HELLO TO ALL FAMILIES, PARENTS, AND CARERS,

Being the start of a new year, what better time is there to introduce the Wellbeing Team for 2023!! Meg Holmes is a staple of the Bendigo SDS community and wellbeing team, working as the school's Family Support teacher for the past number of years. Drew Barrett is a newer member of the team, fulfilling the Mental Health Practitioner role for the last 2 years. Both are passionate not only about the mental health and wellbeing of our students, but of our families as well, ensuring that everyone feels connected and supported in our schooling community and beyond. Here is a little more about the team!!



Meg is our part time family support worker and enjoys working and supporting families (Mon, Wed & Thu). She is a teacher and also has experience as a parent raising a child with additional needs. We at BSDS understand that raising a child with special needs is a challenge at times and if we can be of assistance, we will help or find other resources to support you. Meg often chats with families around issues of; parenting, NDIS plans and concerns, advocacy, Centrelink and disability supports, school refusal, and medical issues that may effect you and your family. Meg's office is in the front entrance area and is happy for you to drop by, but to be sure to catch her it is best to call the school office and make a time to chat on the phone, by Webex or in person. Meg also supports the "Parent to Parent" coffee mornings where parents can share resources and their journeys together.

Drew is our full time Mental Health Practitioner and is a qualified Social Worker, having experience in both school settings and the family violence sector. Drew has a strong passion for working to support our student's mental health and expanding their skills and toolkits to support their own wellbeing. Our students may have an array of concerns that Drew supports within the school setting, with a lot of common concerns being issues with Anxiety, Peer Relationships, School Refusal, Sexualised Behaviours and Family Concerns. As well as supporting students, Drew also works alongside Meg to support our families with any challenges they may be facing and is always happy to have a chat. If you ever wish to discuss concerns with Drew you're welcome to put through a phone call to the office and connect with him through our lovely office staff.
