Welcome Back

It is wonderful to welcome back all of our students and families, with a special welcome to our new students and their families for the 2021 school year. The first thing you may have noticed with this newsletter is our new look format. We have changed the layout of our newsletter format to incorporate your feedback about wanting the important dates to be front and centre, and also to reflect our new school vision and values. You may recall that staff worked on developing these last year. Stay tuned for a celebration to officially launch the new vision values once we all get settled into the new school year.

We have an exciting year of learning and fun ahead, with several major school events on the 2021 school calendar. These include our up and coming Cultural Day, our four yearly School Review, the construction of our \$300,000 Inclusive Sports Hub precinct including a synthetic multi-sports court, a Debutante Ball for this year's graduates and it is the year of our whole school production!

Great Start Conferences

Next **Friday 12th February** 2020, will be our Great Start Conference Day. There will be no normal classroom programs on this day, and students only attend their interview time with their parents and carers. The Great Start Conferences (GSC) are an opportunity to talk about how your child is settling into the schooling year, possible learning, social and emotional goals for the Semester, how parents would prefer to communicate with the teaching team and anything else that you think may be of benefit to discuss. This meeting can be face to face (with all adults wearing masks as per the latest restrictions) or via video conferencing if you would prefer. COVID restrictions update

These include washing and sanitising our hands, maintaining physical distancing where possible and for students who are unwell to stay at home. Wurrung name for the undercover area on the bike track by Dja Dja Wurrung Elder Aunt Marilyn Nicholls.. She will also perform a formal Welcome to Country and Smoking Ceremony. Talented

Didgeridoo player Jason Kerr will play during the Smoking Ceremony. Further celebrations will include Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander activities, including traditional face painting, food samples of traditional food prepared by the Murrong Mummas, traditional games and many more. The formal proceedings will commence at 1200 pm, so please allow time to sign in at the front office before heading to the bike track area.

Assemblies

We are looking forward to welcoming parents and carers back to our face to face assemblies from week 4 of this term. Over the COVID period, our Student Leadership Team have been hosting virtual assemblies within the school. They have learnt skills in video editing and production, including staging and lighting, presenting to a camera, interviewing staff and students and writing content for the different segments. The Student Leadership Team have a strong desire to continue this work, so we have decided to have face to face assemblies on a three week rotation. That will mean that each term we have assemblies in Weeks 1,4,7 and 10. We will send home reminders and hope to see you there to celebrate our students' achievement.

Hamish Morcom (full-time Occupational Therapist),





Conveyance Allowance 2021

In some locations, eligible students are unable to access free school buses, or have to travel 4.8 kms or more to the bus pick up/drop off point.

The conveyance allowance helps cover the costs resulting from any transport gaps between the public transport system and the school bus network, or where multiple transport services are required to get to and from school.

The allowance can be applied to the use of public transport, private cars, private buses and taxis.

Eligibility for a conveyance allowance is based on the following criteria:

- Students must attend the nearest specialist school
- Students must live at least 4.8km from the school or nearest bus pick up / drop off point.

If you consider your child is eligible for this allowance please contact the office for an application form as soon as possible.

If you have already applied successfully in 2020 and your circumstances have not changed, you are not required to reapply in 2021.
