## PRINCIPAL'S REPORT



#### **COVID UPDATE**

I have once again had confirmation from the Department of Education and Training that we will be in remote and flexible learning for the remainder of Term 3. This means that we will continue to post remote learning tasks on the SeeSaw platform. Whilst we know that this is far from ideal for many students, the health advice from the Chief Medical Officer is focussed on reducing movement in and around the community to suppress the Delta variant of the Coronavirus. As information with regard to Term 4 becomes available, I will communicate this to you via the email that you have provided to the school. If you have not been receiving emails from me, please update your details as soon as possible with the office.

#### **VACCINATION INFORMATION**

The Victorian Government is encouraging everyone over the age of 12 to get vaccinated and the Department of Education and Training is working very closely with the Department of Health to share information relating to the vaccine role out. The QR code in this newsletter will give you a link to the Department of Health COVID-19 vaccine information page where you can find out about the vaccines and also book an appointment. As a school, we are not able to provide anyone with health advice, and would urge you to talk to your GP about any health concerns you may have that relate to you, or any member of your family receiving a vaccine.

At this stage, we have not been advised about a vaccination program for COVID 19 taking place within the school. If such a program was to take place, this would follow the usual process of parents providing informed consent for their child to receive the vaccine.

#### **CANCELLED PUPIL FREE DAY**

Next Thursday 9<sup>th</sup> September was a planned Pupil Free Day. This has now been cancelled due to a combination of our guest speaker not being allowed to attend the school and to a greater extent, our understanding of the pressures that families are experiencing at this time. As such, onsite supervision and remote and flexible learning will continue.

#### **COVID THE MUSICAL CANCELLED**

With the ongoing uncertainty of the current outbreak, reducing the time students are onsite at school for rehearsals and practice, and with the restrictions that will most probably be in place threatening our ability to stage our whole school production in front of a packed Ulumbarra Theatre, as was the case with our hugely successful Rainbow Fish Musical, we have made the difficult decision to postpone the production until 2022.

This will be a huge disappointment for those students who have been cast in leading roles, who are in there last year of schooling, and for the hard work and effort that students, staff and families have already put into this production. We are hopeful that we will be able to have some sort of dramatic presentation towards the later stages of Term 4, and will keep you informed as we progress towards showcasing the incredible talents of our students.













#### **FATHER'S DAY**

I was very interested to learn that a tradition to celebrate father's dates back to the Middle Ages in some cultures. One story I read about relayed a story of a son carving a message onto clay to wish his father a long and healthy life, others related to religious observances of differing civilisations and fast forwarding several hundred years, proclamation in Australia in the 1930's that the first Sunday in September would be the national day of observance. Whilst the origins may not be clear, we do know how important the role models in our students' lives are, and how we don't always give them the credit they deserve. Sometimes it is also difficult for our students to tell the people who are close to them, how much they really do mean to them. They may not say "I love and appreciate you", but they do want to be near you, relax when you are around, feel safe in your presence, appreciate you knowing what they are thinking, and are so grateful for you relentless love and care. So this Sunday, I wish every Dad, Step Dad, Grandpa, Pa, Poppy, Opa, Uncle, Brother and friends of our students, a wonderful day to pay tribute to the huge influence and the positive significance that you play in their lives and in our school community.

#### NOT EVERYTHING IS CANCELLED

This newsletter is filled with explanations for the many and varied events and activities that we so love in our school being cancelled or postponed. It is a difficult time and I want to reassure everyone that in dealing with this pandemic, it is okay to have moments when you are not okay. If you are experiencing these moment's please reach out to us as we are only too willing to support you and your family in any way that we can. That said, I just can't end my update on such a negative note. That's why I want to leave you with this great reflection about the things that we currently DO have access to and are NOT cancelled. I must admit that I have had to remind myself of these often in the last few weeks, and I hope as the sun comes out, that our goal of better days ahead will also. Please take care.

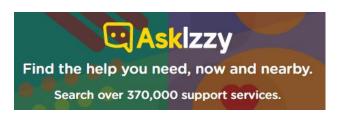


## **CONNECTING PEOPLE**

## WELFARE AND FAMILY SUPPORT TEAM



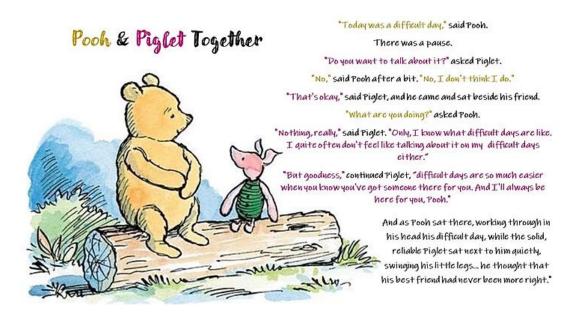
Hello parents, carers, students & staff (3)

This coming Thursday the 9<sup>th</sup> of September is **R U OK? Day** in Australia. This is a day focussed on harm prevention and mental health promotion as it encourages people to stay connected and have conversations that can help others through difficult times in their lives.

Their work aims to build the motivation, confidence and skills of the person able to have meaningful conversations with someone who may be struggling in their life.

R U OK? Contributes to suicide prevention efforts by encouraging people to invest more time in their personal relationships and building the capacity of informal support networks – friends, families and colleagues – to be alert to those around them, have a conversation if they identify signs of distress or difficulty and connect someone to appropriate support, long before they're in crisis.

At Bendigo SDS, we will be acknowledging and showing our support for this day by wearing a touch of yellow on this day and participating in some classroom activities such as making yellow stress balls to go with the theme.

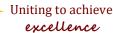
